


space-saving chairs on the market, its name comes from the fact that 40 chairs can be stacked in a space just 4ft high.

The Howe 40/4 chair was created by American designer David Rowland in 1962 and has been in continuous production since 1964 with over 7million chairs sold. It has been made under licence by Howe in Denmark for the European market since 1973. The Howe 40/4 has won many design awards including the prestigious Milan Triennale in 1964. It is also in the permanent collection of the Museum of Modern Art in New York.
