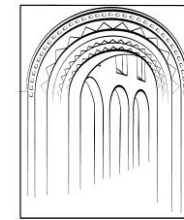

Baptism and First Communion: In accordance with the discipline of the Church in Wales, the sacrament of the Eucharist (Holy Communion) may now be received by all baptised Christians, including small children with the written consent of their parents. Both of these will happen **in July**. Children who worship with us and whose parents consent to their being admitted to Holy Communion will be given some modest preparation. Please let the clergy have their names and your (the parents') contact details in writing. The Choirs and Sunday School know about this. Some children may wish for baptism at this time. Again, please supply the clergy with contact details so that arrangements can be made.

Adults who are baptised are free to present themselves for Holy Communion though, if you wish to do so, you might like to ask the clergy to arrange some further understanding of the place of Holy Communion in your life and faith.

Confirmation will continue to mark the transition into a more mature Christian faith when older children and adults take on for themselves the commitment to their faith. Candidates for Confirmation will be presented to the bishop later in the year. Further details will follow in due course.

A **'Week of Accompanied Prayer'**, July 16 - 22. This is an opportunity for members of the Cathedral congregations to deepen their relationship with God. The event is like being on a retreat without needing to go away from home and without needing to be in silence. This event will make particular sense to those who came to the Lent Course and wish to build on that but *this event is open to all and needs absolutely no previous experience*. All that is involved, apart from an opening meeting and a closing meeting, is a daily conversation with a trained 'Companion', from Monday to Friday, at a time to suit you. More details will follow in the next weeks but please note that there will be a 'Taster' session in the Cathedral on Wednesday 21st June at 7pm. The question isn't why you should join in this Week but, rather, why you shouldn't. LT
