During Advent, there will be a series of talks and thoughts called '**Advent Theologies**' led by Canon Mark in the Cathedral on Tuesdays between 7.30 and 9.00 p.m. The themes for each week will be: Jürgen Moltmann, 'Theology of Hope' (28 November); Catherine of Siena, 'Theology of Peace' (5 December); C.S. Lewis, 'Theology of Joy' (12 December); Julian of Norwich, 'Theology of Love' (19 December). After Canon Mark's talk on each of these, there will be a chance to discuss the theme of the talk in small groups. On Saturday 2 December we are launching an event called "**The Ark**" at 8.30 – 10.00 a.m. This is a social and creative event and is primarily geared for young families.
